

1864 Our History

May 5, 1864 - The American Civil War, The Battle of the Wilderness, Northern Virginia.

Ultimately, the purity of Jeremiah's heart and his gift of literacy, a personal cache of letters, and the spirits of the wilderness help guide Samuel back home to be reunited with his wife and face his own humanity. In the end, the journey reveals that Jeremiah was Samuel's guiding light of destiny all along.




